Dear Siblings in Christ,
Grace and peace to you in the Name of the Blessed One, the only One of life, truth, and everlasting hope. Well, this is my third attempt at a newsletter article. The second attempt will wind up in part of my Palm Sunday message. The first one didn't really have much of point or a take away. I think that part of the problem is that I have been trying to remember a song about belonging and baptism from a discernment event at United Lutheran Seminary, Gettysburg many years ago. It is a contemporary song written by a little-known artist. I can't remember enough lyrics or anything to call it to mind or to find it in a search. All I can remember is a portion that went something like, when the world blames me or shames me, you claim me and call me,... beloved. I know, you can't hear it, but maybe you can relate to only remembering a piece of something in a precious memory. I do remember how it made me feel. This is probably the most important part of my reflection this month. The discernment event was designed for youth that could possibly be discerning a future in church leadership, although it wasn't a requirement. Our youth were enthused about the event. The closing song from worship was this mystery song. I remember we were all impacted by its tune and its unassuming but powerful melody. I remember driving home thinking how the song had an important message that whatever path we might chose, we are God's. If we live, we live to the Lord, and if we die, we die to the Lord; so then, whether we live or whether we die, we are the Lord's. +Romans 14:8

So, whether I ever find out what that song was or not, I can remember its lingering message that echoes Paul's letter to the church in Rome. No matter what, God know us and has claimed us. When our memories are not quite what we might like, God still remembers us. Even if we
would count ourselves as "lost" in life, we are always found by a loving a merciful God.

Another interesting aspect of this writing was all the gems that I didn't intend to find (An excerpt from spiritual giant Henri Nouwen's work on "beloved" came up in my search and it is too good to not share on the next page!). Again and again, Google failed, but I continued to remember and cherish other songs and great memories. I located lots of connections and wondered about future uses. I even tried AI. It also failed. I remembered the organizing pastor's name and was able to look him up. If he gets back to me the name of the song before press time, I will share it with you. The whole search process also confirmed for me the need for human connections and networking. It also confirmed the problem with trying to find something that subscribes more to the Theology of the Cross than the theology of glory-that is, not a top song or the most well- known, but meaningful in its weak-is-strong message. It is often the things in life that are hard to find and hard to hold onto that are so much more valuable. Jesus' own passion and death was forgettable for the scoffers that were there. No one thought that a poor rebellious Rabbi and self-appointed Son of Humanity would amount to very much. We silenced him they probably proudly said the next day. Yet, it was the women who went through the extra effort, the search for what happened.

Keep searching and seeking. The journey brings meaning. Study what God places before you. Consider again the Passion of our Lord and what it means for us and for you. Let the one who was blamed and cast aside as a criminal be your partner in your search. You won't be disappointed! May you and yours rejoice with the Rescuer who has already found us.

## An excerpt from Life of the Beloved by Henri Nouwen.

"Aren't you, like me, hoping that some person, thing, or event will come along to give you that final feeling of inner well being you desire? Don't you often hope: "Maybe this book, idea, course, trip, job, country, or relationship will fulfill my deepest desire." But as long as you are waiting for that mysterious moment you will go on running helter skelter, always anxious and restless, always lustful and angry, never fully satisfied. You know that this is the compulsiveness that keeps us going and busy, but at the same time makes us wonder whether we are getting anywhere in the long run. This is the way to spiritual exhaustion and burnout. This is the way to spiritual death.
Well, you and I don't have to kill ourselves. We are the Beloved. We are intimately loved long before our parents, teachers, spouses, children, and friends loved or wounded us. That's the truth of our lives. That's the truth I want you to claim for yourself. That's the truth spoken by the voice that says, "You are my Beloved."
Listening to that voice with great inner attentiveness, I hear at my center words that say: "I have called you by name, from the very beginning. You are mine and I am yours. You are my Beloved, on you my favor rests. I have molded you in the depths on the earth and knit you together in your mother's womb. I have carved you in the palms of my hands and hidden you in the shadow of my embrace. I look at you with infinite tenderness and care for you with care more intimate than that of a mother for her child. I have counted every hair on your head and guided you at every step. Wherever you go, I go with you, and wherever you rest, I keep watch. I will give you food that will satisfy all your hunger and drink that will quench all your thirst. I will not hide my face from you. You know me as your own as I know you as my own. You belong to me. I am your father, your mother, your brother, your sister, your lover, and your spouse...yes, even your child...wherever you are I will be. Nothing will ever separate us. We are one."

## MINUTES FOR COUNCIL MEETING, February 8th, 2024

CALL TO ORDER: Council members present include Chad Altman, Jason Barnhart, Shawn Carolan, *Kim Elias, Bonny Free, Joanne Gebhardt,* Deb Mertz, John Millward, Jason Nestor, Jeanne Toohey, *Rick Yaksic, *Brad Zundel, *Pastor Fitch, and Pastor Caroline. Others present were Robyn Henry. The meeting was called to order by John Millward at 7:00 pm with a prayer by Pastor Caroline . *Members who were excused from this month's meeting. APPROVAL OF MINUTES OF LAST MEETING: Minutes were approved as read.
TREASURER REPORT: Council reviewed the finance reports. A motion was made to accept the treasurer's report by Shawn C with a second by Jeanne Toohey. Motion carried.
PASTOR Andrew's REPORT:

We continue to have had a few guests and interests in our congregation recently, with positive feedback! Positives help engage and welcome people (negativity tends to repel newcomers and those on the fence). This period has been particularly heavy in administration, but with good results! I recently met with Scott McKenzie of Horizons and we are working on scheduling our next informational session with him about a Capital Campaign and strengthening our stewardship efforts. This first meeting will be over zoom with a smaller group, but he offered to come to Council after that. I think that you will find him to be knowledgeable, helpful and a fan of the correct teams. I am planning for a "Messy Communion" event-a First Communion through millionth communion, Congregational, Cross-generational, dinner church (potluck), activities and fun time on March 17th from probably 3:30-6pm. PASTOR Caroline's REPORT: Preaching \& Worship - There is a preaching schedule in place for the pastors. The preaching schedule has been planned through Lent and Easter. We are having one worship at 9 AM on February 11th, followed by the congregation meeting; the council decided to do this to have only one congregational meeting instead of 3. Pr. Andrew and I have been working with Robyn Henry to help her assimilate into the role of administrative assistant. We also facilitated doing the bulletins, newsletter, and bulletin of reports, and these took significant time out of normal our schedule. Pastoral Care - Visits include in person, at the church, home, assisted living space, eating out, and hospitals. There is a visitation protocol in place. There have been extended phone calls for people who do not wish or have time for a pastor to visit in person. Special Events - January was relatively slow for special events. Attended Spaghetti dinner, but only take-out. Christian Education - We began Sunday School; I will be rotating through classes this year, and filling in when a teacher cannot be there. Planning for the National Youth Gathering has begun, with Sheri Anderson leading. We are in the middle of making arrangements for the meeting by securing lodging and flights. Highlights: This month has been a little quieter than usual, but we have also been planning for Lent and Easter. Robyn Henry started as our administrative assistant, and it will take training and time for her to learn the job. Pr. Andrew and I did the bulletins, newsletter, and bulletin of reports because Robyn only started mid-month.
Family Ministry Coordinator REPORT: This past month (January) has been filled with transitions. I have been making myself available to help in the church's day-to-day operations during the transition from no secretary to a new secretary. I have spent much time in prayers of gratitude for the hiring of Robyn Henry as she has joined the staffing team.
I have been working through technology difficulties with the internet and printer outages. I have attended a ministry team retreat and staff meetings. I organized the Scout Sunday recognition service. Held a National Youth Gathering meeting and worked on the yearly annual reports that fall under my ministries. I had recently teamed up with Laurie to have children and youth sing at the January 28th, 10:30 am service. I am currently working on a suggested Lenten curriculum for the elementary-age Sunday school program. I am also creating a lesson plan for the Midweek Lenten Kids Gathering and preparing for the Shrove Tuesday fundraiser to benefit the delegates attending the National Youth Gathering in July. Removing and repairing the Ga-Ga Pit with our BSA troop. Helping a youth receive her Silver Award for Girl Scouts. My door has been open to the needs of prayers, concerns, laments, and suggestions of congregation members. I have been working to promote the events and happenings of HZ through our Facebook page, website, and signboard. The post has since been removed. We would like to thank Council for supporting our recommendations for changing the status of the position and for approving our hiring of Robyn.

## PRESCHOOL COMMITTEE:

We have been busy working on our curriculum as well and report cards which went home at the end of January. February brought Groundhog Day as well as, Valentines Day, Beach Day and Pajama Day ,that are upcoming. We started Fall 2024 preschool registration in January of 2024. Our classes are as follows: M, W,F 9-12 Pre- K kids only at $180 \$$ per MONTH. Class is full with 22 students. Tuesday, Thursday 2 years until kindergarten/ 9:30-11:30am 140\$ per MONTH Class is full with 20 students. This is a total, school wide, of 42 students for Fall, that we will be excepting. We will only be offering morning classes for Fall, as previously mentioned, in past preschool reports. I plan on putting in less classroom hours and doing more of the School Director duties, as maintaining everything is becoming more difficult for me after 21 years. We do offer discounts for multiple children in a household, to give parents a break on tuition rates. We also offer reduced tuition for those in need or if they cannot afford our full monthly rate. All of these decisions, of family need, are handled by me and are confidential. We are proud to offer all of these savings to our families. Thanks to church and council support and low monthly donation to the church, we are able to keep our tuition low, include extra discounts and also be able to pay 5 teachers. Although, my teacher, work very hard and are very giving of their extra time and talents.
