Dear Siblings in Christ,

"God's peace to you all! We all need God's peace." "God is good, all the time. All the time, God is good!" Have you heard such inspiring call and response pieces? They sound like they have been borrowed from litanies of the broader church and pasted into daily life (because they were!). I have always found a delightful glimpse of full Resurrection joy when one of these or a piece of a Bible verse is shared in the midst of an ordinary moment. Knowing responses, smiles and "Amen!" lifts up the time into a recognition of God-breathed presence in all times and places.

Of course, naming the Name and giving praise to God in ordinary and extraordinary moments requires an attitude that embraces Resurrection joy even if God seems very hidden. Joy can be one of the most difficult of spiritual attitudes when things are confusing, painful, and full of sadness.

In preparation for my Bible Study session, it hit me again that the hiddenness of God is a big deal. It is there in my favorite Bible story in Luke 24. It is a thread in all of the Resurrection Appearances. Why do they not quite recognize Jesus immediately? Is it that Jesus looks a little different or is it that God veils God's self until we look closer, leaning hope and faith. Is that you God? Where is God and why can't we always see God? Why must we live in this world where God's eternal and magnificent presence is not immediately obvious? How often do we miss it? My mind connected to the presence candle in the Sanctuary—how often do we forget its symbol and its meaning?! It is there in God's House, wherever and whenever a few of us come together in Jesus' Name, to remind us of God's never-failing presence. When all the lights are on, we might not even give it a moment's thought. A little light burning on and on. When the room is dark, though, I have found myself actually noticing what has consistently been

there. My heart knows this prevailing truth. It is in dark times that we look for and seek out that little light that cheers us and helps us to not just remember but welcome tears of knowing comfort. It is sad but true that so often our faith is pulsing stronger through our active mind when we are working hardest against fears and questioning. Of course, if we get lost looking around for the answer that we think we should get we are more like those many sailing ships in early America adrift in rough weather—forgetting to look for the lighthouse and it alone. Yes, distraction away from the stability and the guiding light of God is a serious danger (as much then as now).

So, we might miss God's nudges sometimes, but that's okay, there are other prophets, preachers and poets that will share this truth: God is hidden because all lovers know that it is in the looking for the loving connection when it is most unsure that love is truly known and proven to exist.

Yet, time and time again, we realize that the joy of Easter is not so hard to find. It is a delightful surprise to realize that God broke a few of God's own rules to prove the eternal truth of God's faithful and steadfast love. The rules used to be: "Death has a final voice." And "A God that is worth being called a God cannot embarrass or disprove itself by showing an ultimate weakness." Please note that they have been replaced. Do not live as though they are still in place. Write down or sing instead, "Death has been swallowed up in victory!" and "Love one another just as I have loved you!"

May you discover Easter joy and blessings!

This is the theme of 1 John 3:16-24: "¹⁶ We know love by this, that he laid down his life for us—and we ought to lay down our lives for the brothers and sisters. ¹⁷ How does God's love abide in anyone who has the world's goods and sees a brother or sister in need and yet refuses help? ¹⁸ Little children, let us love not in word or speech but in deed and truth.... ²³ And this is his commandment, that we should believe in the name of his Son Jesus Christ and love one another, just as he has commanded us. ²⁴ All who obey his commandments abide in him, and he abides in them. And by this we know that he abides in us, by the Spirit that he has given us."

It's important that we care for others as we care for ourselves. Sometimes we assume that means we only rely on ourselves, our own energy and compassion. And while we do need to care for ourselves first, we do so we can be able to care for others. We can love others out of abundance of our love that was poured into us by God – it is from the love of God that we can care for others. I am so blessed to be a pastor, as God allows me to be kind to everyone as part of my vocation. God wants us to show his love to others by caring for others. Whenever you encounter someone in need, first keep in mind the love that God and Jesus have for us.

The meeting was called to order by John Millward at 7:00pm with devotion by Pastor Fitch. *Members who were excused from this month's meeting. **APPROVAL OF MINUTES OF LAST MEETING**: Minutes were approved as read. **TREASURER REPORT:** Council reviewed the February finance reports. Motion carried .PASTOR Andrew's REPORT: Devotional Time: Turn Your Church Inside Out – Chapter 3; next month - chapter 5 (both in mailboxes) **Preliminary Financial** – From Tammy, we will have the full report from Denny soon: Giving for March was up - \$47000 for operating income (unrestricted), \$12859 to the good for the month and \$5542 to the good for the year. Narrative, Remarks and Notations: It is a wonderful thing to give praise and thanks to God for the death and Resurrection of Christ! We had a delightful Holy Week, and I am glad to be celebrating Easter! I am thankful to mark one year of service with you all on Tuesday the 16th (Call Anniversary is 2/25&26). The first year is one of observation, prayer and discernment. My Ministry Plan and Goals -2024 Goal Area 1: Creation and implementation of a Vision and Ministry Plan for Harrold Zion Evangelical Lutheran Church. Through discernment, research, and observation a vision and ministry plan will be created for Harrold Zion Lutheran Church by January 31, 2024. This has been completed. The ministry team will share in a mini retreat to study the vision and

discuss how this vision can be fulfilled in each of our ministry areas. Goals will be developed that will be measurable and shared with the council and the

In process; high priority. In conversation and review of ministry with Pastor Caroline, Sheri and Laurie, I have the following observations and summaries of their Goals and process. Pastor Caroline – I will be meeting with her next week in order to clarify, provide alignment, and work on details and timeline that will be fruitful for the established vision. There have been extended phone calls for people who do not wish or have time for a pastor to visit in person. The grief support group begins April 18th. Special Events – Attended Palm Sunday breakfast event. Led two classes and services for Lent. Attended Easter Egg Hunt. Sheri Anderson has begun preparing for VBS, and Pr. Andrew and I will be available to lead where needed. Participated in Holy Week. Added shoes to the shoe collection. **Christian Education** – I have been filling in for Sunday School classes when a teacher cannot be there; this high school kids filled plastic eggs for the Easter Egg Hunt. Planning for the National Youth Gathering has begun, with Sheri Anderson leading. We have secured flights, lodging and registration. Another session of the classes based on the book "Believe" will begin in April 16th. Meetings - Care and Leadership for Rostered Ministers Committee: The recommendations for minimum synod guidelines were submitted to the synod council for approval (and they were approved), and the final draft will be on the agenda for the synod assembly to approve. The committee is also working toward education of congregations and councils about the benefits of sabbatical, for both pastors and congregations. **Synod**: Attended monthly ministerium meeting. Pastors and lay people will attend caucuses for conferences to prepare for synod assembly in May; Conference 4 (our conference) will meet May 22 at 7 PM at Salem Delmont (in person only, no zoom). Synod Assembly will take place on June 14th and 15th

(in person but zoom available). **Greensburg Lutheran Cluster**: Pastor bible study happens on a weekly basis, on Tuesdays. Attending Lenten service and lunch on 2/22, at Zion's. I attended and preached at Zion's on 3/21. I also lead Bible study about once a month. **Church committee meetings**: Last year I was working on doing the most recent update for the constitution based on the synod's model constitution that was updated in 2022; the council still needs to approve it. I have also been attending Worship and Music. There was a stewardship meeting to discuss a capital campaign for replenishing our building fund to help the church keep up to date. **Staff meetings:** We have staff meetings to communicate about worship and other things that need to be attended to at the church. We have one full staff meeting per month, although this has not been happening as often the last few months. Sheri and I participate in ministry staff meetings as needed. The pastors have been updating each other but have not been meeting in person as often. **Funerals, Baptisms, and Weddings:** There was one funeral.

The Lenten meals, study, and prayer service went relatively well. Attended the Palm Sunday breakfast and Easter Egg Hunt. The W&M met to discuss Easter through Pentecost.

Family Ministry Coordinator REPORT:

Since last month's report, I have hosted a successful Movie night. The night was well received, and families requested another event in the future. The messy church event scheduled for March 17th was canceled. Confirmation students submitted their Faith Statements, which I presented during a Wednesday Lent service. A new record was set for the annual extravaganza: three weeks to stuff 2000 eggs that were gone in a dash and grab in 3.5 minutes.
