

Call to Worship

If you ask the sky who God is, **the sky will tell you of God's reach.** If you ask the day who God is, **the sun will tell you of God's warmth.** If you ask the night who God is, **the moon will tell you of God's comfort.** "The heavens are telling the glory of God" (Psalm 19:1). Are you listening? **We are listening! We will sing of God's glory.** Let us worship Holy God.

You are invited to stand, as able.

In our scripture for today, Jesus asks the disciples, "Who do you say that I am?" Peter said, "You are the Messiah." Have you ever wondered if his voice faltered when he answered? Did he respond loudly and with confidence, or with a tentative whisper? We'll never know. The text doesn't provide those details. But we can trust that, no matter how we speak to God, when we speak, God is listening.

So, friends, join me in the prayer of confession. Whether you whisper these words or speak to them with conviction, may you trust that our gracious and merciful God is listening with love. You may kneel or stand, as able. Let us pray together:

Pause for everyone to get settled and reflection.

Prayer of Confession

Holy God, some days, we are quick to declare your goodness. Like Peter, we see you in our midst and we are confident in our faith. Other days, we are distracted and uncertain, desperate for answers. Forgive us for losing sight of you. Some days we are quick to trust your blessings— trusting that we are called, that we can make a difference. Other days, our praise falls silent and doubt creeps in. Forgive us for losing sight of ourselves. We know that fear and doubt are part of the journey of faith. But for the days when we are far from you and far from ourselves, we ask for your tender grace. Pull us closer toward you. Remind us of the mountaintop moments of our faith. Amen.





⁴You shall not make for yourself an idol, whether in the form of anything that is in heaven above, or that is on the earth beneath, or that is in the water under the earth. ⁵You shall not bow down to them or worship them; for I the LORD your God am a jealous God, punishing children for the iniquity of parents, to the third and the fourth generation of those who reject me, ⁶but showing steadfast love to the thousandth generation of those who love me and keep my commandments.

⁷You shall not make wrongful use of the name of the LORD your God, for the LORD will not acquit anyone who misuses his name.

Second Reading: 1 Corinthians 1:18-25


¹⁸The message about the cross is foolishness to those who are perishing, but to us who are being saved it is the power of God. ¹⁹For it is written,

I believe in the Holy Spirit, the holy catholic Church, the communion of saints, the forgiveness of sins, the resurrection of the body, and the life everlasting. Amen







<u>The Great Three Days</u>: These high holy days are seen as a continuous event.

Maundy Thursday + March 28 7pm, Good Friday + March 29 7pm, Easter Vigil 5pm +

Maundy Thursday focuses on the healing and building up of faith through the gift of the Holy Sacrament of the Altar. This night celebrates the New Commandment of Jesus for all of us. The service concludes with the stripping of the Altar in preparation for the continuation of the Passion story on **Good Friday**. Dramatic reading of the full passion takes central role in this night of nights. The service concludes with the Adoration of the Cross through the contemplative form of Prayer Around the Cross. This meaningful portion uses short, memorable and repeated songs coupled with devotional prayers. The **Easter Vigil** is the most ancient of Christian worship services. Ours will

take place in our familiar Saturday night time slot. We will gather outside, weather permitting for the lighting of the new fire. This service will follow the shorter selection of readings and simple songs in order to be accessible and meaningful for all. (~1hr)

7am, 8:45am, and 10:30am Special music at all services for this queen of all holy days!
