Dear Congregation Members:

I haven't included a letter in a while, so thought I would add something this month. And this month, I thought I'd write about what the money we give to the church is for. Money has been a little tight the last few years, but somehow, we keep chugging along. So, what is the money for?

Well, it goes to sustain our building, which includes maintenance, cleaning and office supplies, utilities such as electricity, heat, telephones, internet, water, and garbage. And there are people who volunteer for several maintenance jobs, but we also must hire people at times to care for the property.

Money also goes for supporting activities in the church and local/ global charities. This includes making quilts for Lutheran World Relief and knitting prayers shawls. We have a backpack program for kids in need at local elementary schools, Food2Go4Kids. We send money to Compassion International to support two kids in Africa. We sometimes ask for specific donations for various things (goats currently), but our contributions also support charities. And money is needed to have activities for fellowship and Vacation Bible School, just to name a couple.

Then there is the staff. Our pastors are the most visible staff, leading worship and doing funerals, weddings, and baptisms, as well as providing visitation for those who need visits. Our other paid staff includes a secretary, a family ministries coordinator, a custodian, a music director and two organists. We also have volunteers who take care of the altar, usher, acolyte, serve communion, lector, and assist weddings and funerals.

So, did you know if all the giving units just increased their giving \$5 a month (or if you haven't been able to give), we could increase our income by \$20,000 a year? We all know that money is very tight for families right now. We are all feeling the pinch. If you can, please consider giving at least \$5 per month; this is your church, and the funds are needed to keep our church functioning. Your giving is used wisely, not wasted. Remember what the bible verse says, we reap what we sow. What we reap depends on giving.







APPROVAL OF MINUTES OF LAST MEETING: Minutes approved as printed.

TREASURERS REPORT: No Report.

SENIOR PASTOR'S REPORT: Grace to you and peace.

Thank you for sending me to the Larger Church Conference in Tucson, May 2-5, and the Festival of Homiletics in Denver, May 16-20. The Larger Church Conference made it clear to me that the future is in our hands. It will be the congregations that address the fears of this age with confidence, calm, and clarity, that will thrive in the years ahead. Congregations that give into fear, panic, or become complacent, will not be around. I was impressed by the youth and vitality of the senior pastors, especially the vitality of the senior pastors who are approaching retirement. The Festival of Homiletics was a balm for me. My throat was getting parched. The Lord gave me fresh water to drink, as sermon after sermon, lecture after lecture quenched my thirst for the Word. I trust that you will be likewise blessed in the sermons that you hear from me. It was a joy to baptize Freya Grace Knott, in church at the Saturday evening service, May 7th. I got to see Fran and Charlotte Lann. May 24. As some of you may know, Fran was expected to die two years ago. He is doing remarkably well in his third year of hospice care. Mutual Ministry Committee will meet at church on June 14. As was the case with the Transition Team, scheduling is the primary issue. Thank you, Evangelism Committee for ensuring that we have an accurate membership roster. Thanks to Pastor Caroline and her work with the Personnel Committee, we have a Personnel Manual for your review. The congregation's constitution needs to be brought up to date. The main revisions have to do with the section on rostered leaders. Of note, the current constitution does not have Mutual Ministry listed as a committee. The current model constitution does. Finally, it would be good to discuss the extension of the six month interim agreement. For the good of the order, it is good to know if the anniversary celebration involves a pack out. That is all. Pray for me as I pray for you, always in Christ Jesus.

ASSISTANT PASTOR'S REPORT: Preaching & Worship – Pr. West and I have split preaching duties, although I was on vacation the last week of May. We will be having a noon confirmation service on Sunday. Filled in for Pr. West on Wed AM services.

Visitation – Visitation has been busy again this month. Visits include in person and over the phone for homebound, loss of family, and illness (hospital).

Special Events – I led two weddings this month, one here at the church and one at Hartwood Acres. I participated in Food2Go4Kids. I also went to the Sonshiner's Luncheon on May 26. I met with Pr. Ann Schmid to plan for worship on June 27th, for the synod assembly. I also had a phone meeting with Arianna Drive-Hoeg for Prepare and Enrich. I plan on doing an online class for this, to facilitate premarital counseling (cost \$250 as part of my continuing education).

Christian Education – The senior high Sunday morning class has been going very well, with 2-7 students attending, depending on the week. I am very pleased with the relationship building taking place. Sheri and I continue to plan for a summer travel and local activities with the students.

Meetings – Pr. James meetings: 1 time per week with immediate staff, 1 time per week with all the staff, and 1-3 times per week between the two of us.

Synod Ministry Committee meetings: (I am the secretary): we met this time to discuss developing a Lay School of Theology for the synod (training and continuing ed for lay leaders). We will meet again to finalize those discussions. The Synod Council asked the committee to formulate a way to educate congregations about family leave and sabbatical policy. We will be meeting again in June to discuss this further.

Lutheran Campus Board of Pittsburgh (I am the secretary for the board): We had 1 meeting for our quarterly meeting and a retreat the weekend of March 26. I participated through Zoom since I had to be available for presiding Saturday night. I have decided to not do this next year due to being busy at the church.

Synod: The synod ministerium meets monthly. We will be having Synod Assembly in June.

Greensburg Lutheran Cluster: Pastor bible study on a weekly basis, on Tuesdays.

Church committee meetings: I continue meeting with the personnel committee to discuss providing an employee handbook and as well as addressing policies for a new pastor. We are close to putting together the manual; I am modifying the document that was obtained from the ELCA, in order to fit our situation here at HZLC. I have also been attending Worship and Music, executive council, and stewardship meetings. I am on the Social Ministry Outreach Committee and kept up communication with the chair, Linda Boyer.

Funerals, Baptisms, and Weddings – I presided for 2 weddings in May, on May 20 and May 21. I led 3 funerals this last month. There have been 11 funerals since Nov. 1, 2021 (I've led 8 since then), and 9 since the beginning of the year (I've led 7 of those and participated in 1).

Vacation: Took vacation the last week of May, through Memorial Day (May 23-30).

Highlights: I filled in for Pr. West's Wednesday morning services. I presided at two weddings in May. I met with the synod ministry committee to discuss synod issues regarding congregations and lay leaders. I participated in the synod's monthly meeting. I participated in activities related to the youth (Confirmation). Blessings, Pastor Caroline Clifford

FAMILY MINISTRY CORR DINATOR REPORT: The past month has been filled with Sunday School wrap-up, Covid and VBS. I am thankful for all the healing thoughts and prayers during my sickness and continuing recovery. 11 youth will be confirmed June 5th at their own service, at 12:00pm. It has been an honor to have been a part of their faith formation since they were in preschool. For the next 2 weeks, my days, night and home is filled with Vacation Bible School. This is a wonderful experience not only for the participants but the volunteers. This is the biggest yearly event for the children and

church. I ask for many prayers; Prayers for the Holy Spirit to be with each one of us as we prepare to bring the Bible to life...and prayers for perfect weather.

Pastor Peter Asplin opened the meeting with prayer. He then presented a Bible study discussing discernment and reviewing Genesis, Esther and 1 Samuel.

Pastor Asplin then distributed several handouts. A review of the call process was discussed. Procedures for calling a senior Pastor, the interview process etc. One of the handouts reviewed Call Process information sharing and confidentiality. The other handouts included sample interview questions based on theology, ministry, leadership style, professional and personal growth and leadership as person. The committee reviewed and discussed these thoroughly with Pastor Asplin explaining and answering questions. The last handout dealt with questions that you can't ask at an interview. These examples were reviewed.
