

**FROM THE INTERIM SENIOR PASTOR**

Grace to you and peace,

As I say good-bye to you at the end of the month, this scripture verse comes to mind, “Finally, brothers and sisters, farewell. Put things in order, listen to my appeal, agree with one another, live in peace; and the God of love and peace will be with you.” (2 Corinthians 13: 11) Sometimes I sense that Saint Paul was the first interim pastor. He went from place to place, work for what we would consider a short amount of time and moved on. It’s time for me to move on. It is the love of God that compels me, it is the forgiveness of God that allows me to continue. Along the way, I was blessed to find a companion for my journey, my wife Mary Beth. We celebrate thirty-six years together as married folk with five adult children. It looks like our way of life will continue “unto the next generations” as our children also move about and explore different callings and vocations.

As I have closed most of my correspondence with you, I do so again, knowing that “The One who began a good work in you will bring it to conclusion by the Day of the Lord (Philippians 1: 6).



APPROVAL OF MINUTES OF LAST MEETING: Minutes approved as read.

TREASURERS REPORT: Report provided by Bob Majcher. Motion to approve report by Shawn Carolan. Second by Rick Yaksick. Motion carried.

SENIOR PASTOR'S REPORT: As this marks our eighteenth month together, in the twenty-first month since Pr John's retirement, it is good to recap the accomplishments of our work together.

The first achievement was Pastor Caroline's pastoral leadership of the staff from 1 Nov. through the first months of 2021. The resumption of in person worship in February was remarkable.

The next milestone was establishing a weekly routine under new pastoral leadership. "We hadn't done it this way before." Getting used to a new pastor, though temporary, is the way a congregation learns to adjust and adapt. Rolling with the punches, as it were, prepares the staff for the adjustments and adaptations that will come with the next regularly called senior pastor.

The next step was working with the Transition Team. It was a new concept for the congregation. The pandemic made what had been routine for me, a new and challenging experience for me. We weren't able to have in home meetings or larger gatherings in the church. The Town Hall meeting, around the time of Rally Day, marked a turning point. We discovered and agreed to work on programs and activities for that middle group of 20-45 year-olds. The Sunday meeting with parents and children that followed identified people who later became active in the educational programs of the congregation.

The Vacation Bible School of 2021 and 2022 boosted morale for all of us. The steady programming of the All About Kids Preschool demonstrated that we will get through both the pandemic and the interim.

It was a grave disappointment when the triennial Youth Gathering scheduled for Minneapolis was cancelled. The Director of Youth and Family Ministries, Sheri Anderson, and I had made some preliminary plans for a youth trip to D.C. My contact pastor in the Metro D.C. Synod, like us, had too many prior commitments to add something new.

The Personnel Committee has produced an employee manual for council's review. It reviewed the position descriptions of our staff. The Mission and Vision Team is presenting their work to us tonight. Pastor Caroline has been working on the Model Constitution. The work is ready for the task force to review it. The Stewardship Committee has found ways to make the program

more robust, moving beyond an annual presentation to one that is seasonal, almost monthly. By the way, we did raise enough money to fund 250 goats for the World Hunger Appeal.

The Mutual Ministry Committee met for the first time in June and is scheduled to meet monthly through the Summer and bimonthly during the rest of the year.

This month marks the beginning of our church secretary, Tammy Hilland, working full time so she has the time to do all the things that need to get done in the administration of the congregation.

The Worship and Music Committee continues to accomplish great things. Perhaps the biggest achievement learning to work with this interim pastor.

The Evangelism Committee is on track for another outstanding Rally Day. The Fellowship Committee has some entertaining ideas for the months ahead. Stand by.

Social Ministry works steadily to ensure the needs of the most vulnerable in our community are cared for.

Property keeps things running well.

And, drum roll, the 250th Anniversary Committee is working overtime now to produce a weekend to remember at the end of the month.

**ASSISTANT PASTOR'S REPORT: Preaching & Worship** – Pr. West wanted to me to preach one weekend for the months of June and July, but will return to normal starting in August. We will be having a 5 PM confirmation for Carson Chenowith on Saturday, July 9th.

**Visitation** – Visitation has been busy again this month. Visits include in person and over the phone for homebound, loss of family, and illness (hospital).

**Special Events** – I participated in Food2Go4Kids. I also had a phone meeting with Arianna Drive-Hoeg for Prepare and Enrich. I have been doing an online class for this, to facilitate premarital counseling (cost \$250 as part of my continuing education).

**Christian Education** – After discussion with Sheri and Pr. West, I will be doing one of the confirmation classes starting in the fall.

**Meetings** –

Pr. James meetings: 1 time per week with immediate staff, 1 time per week with all the staff, and 1-3 times per week between the two of us.

Synod Ministry Committee meetings: (I am the secretary): We were to meet in June, but because of vacations, the meeting didn't take place. The meeting was elated to the Lay School of Theology and will take place later.

Lutheran Campus Board of Pittsburgh (I am the secretary for the board): I have decided to not do this next year due to being busy at the church.

Synod: The synod ministerium meets monthly. We had Synod Assembly in June.

Greensburg Lutheran Cluster: Pastor bible study on a weekly basis, on Tuesdays. A special meeting will be held on July 12th at Brush Creek as the bishop will be attending.

Church committee meetings: I continue meeting with the personnel committee to discuss providing an employee handbook and as well as addressing policies for a new pastor. We are close to putting together the manual. I am modifying the document that was obtained from the ELCA, to fit our situation here at HZLC. It has been completed and is in the hands of the council for approval. I have also completed finishing up the update of the constitution for the 2019 version. I have also been attending Worship and Music, executive council, and stewardship meetings. I am on the Social Ministry Outreach Committee and kept up communication with the chair, Linda Boyer.

Funerals, Baptisms, and Weddings –I have presided for one funeral, and am meeting with a parent about getting their child baptized and possibly joining the church.

Highlights: The main highlight is the 250th anniversary weekend. I will attend a few of the meetings prior to the main event. I am working on getting certified as a Facilitator for Prepare and Enrich, a training program for premarital counseling. I completed the church handbook and will submit the revision of the church constitution (it has been completed).

1. \$5000.00 was transferred from the Cemetery Committee checking account to the Cemetery Investment Fund during this period. The approximate return does not reflect this cash transfer.

2. Changes were made to all investments in the Congregation Investment Fund to have cash available to transfer to the congregation checking account. This fund includes significant monies that are a) donor designated, b) specifically set aside by council after the parsonage sale, c) designated by council for major property improvements and maintenance, and d) available for general operations (Current Fund) such as personnel, utility, regular maintenance, and other costs associated with operating the church.
