Dear Siblings in Christ,

My mind often drifts at this time of year to all the powerful ways that God has been me and us over the past year. The tremendous power of the Story of the Epiphany Star and the unusual gifts of the Magi bring an automatic sense of wonder. Honestly, this is one of the things that I love about my calling—encouraging others in this wonder about what God is doing right now and a joyful anticipation of what blessings God will bring for the coming days.

Along this line, one thing that continues to inspire me is the poem, "By Powers of Good." It was written on New Years, 1945 and sent as a Christmas greeting from cell number 92, by Dietrich Bonhoeffer. It has been set to music and is found in German Hymnals under the title "Von Guten Machten" I usually play it from YouTube around New year (it is beautiful in German and English). Here is the English translation from *Letters and Papers from Prison*:

- By faithful, quiet powers of good surrounded so wondrously consoled and sheltered here— I wish to live these days with you in spirit and with you enter into a new year.
- 2. The old year still would try our hearts to torment,of evil times we still do bear the weight;O Lord, do grant our souls, now terror-stricken, salvation for which you did us create.
- 3. And should you offer us the cup of suffering, though heavy, brimming full and bitter brand, we'll thankfully accept it, never flinching, from your good heart and your beloved hand.
- 4. But should you wish now once again to give us the joys of this world and its glorious sun,

- then we'll recall anew what past times brought us
- and then our life belongs to you alone.
- 5. The candles you have brought into our darkness, let them today be burning warm and bright, and if it's possible, do reunite us!
 We know your light is shining through the night.
- When now the quiet deepens all around us,
 O, let our ears that fullest sound amaze of this, your world, invisibly expanding as all your children sing high hymns of praise.
- 7. By powers of good so wondrously protected, we wait with confidence, befall what may. God is with us at night and in the morning and oh, most certainly on each new day.

Like many poems that got turned into hymns, scripture connections abound—Psalm139:5 ("You surround me on all sides and hold your hand over me"); Psalm 119 (verse 3 of poem has many connections with this long Psalm); the "and if it's possible" (vs. 5) seems to be an allusion to Matthew 26:39 from the Garden of Gethsemane. In relation to the opening verse, Dietrich says (in *Love Letters from Cell 92*, page 269), "It is a great, invisible realm we live in, of whose real existence we have no doubt. When it says in the old children's song about the angels: 'two who cover me, two who awaken me', this protection night and day by invisible powers of good is something we adults today need no less than the children." This poem reminds us that the "season of angels" that the secular world celebrated last month is not actually confined to any one month. We need to remember that we are not ever alone. No matter how bad things might seem to be, God's presence is by our side. Jesus is not hard to find, but is quite comfortable wandering around, teaching, and at home in his "Father's house" (Luke 2)—wherever a few of us are gathered and giving thanks and praise in God's Name.

May you and yours be filled with wonder and blessings as you greet this new year full of anticipation for what God is doing around us, and may you truly trust in the wondrous and powerful shelter of all of the good that is God's in this awesome Creation. May we use what is ours for the care of those who need guide points to find their path back to the Way of Life.

Dear Sisters and Brothers in Christ:

"Hope is worth the risk!" This was the theme for Advent 4, according to Sanctified Art. "The language of a dream is the language of hope," writes Bishop Michael Curry. Propelled by this hope, Joseph uses his position not just for personal faithfulness, but as an act of profound communal responsibility by choosing to protect and stand by Mary. Instead of living out of fear for what others may say or think, Joseph places his hope in something bigger than himself." We can see the hope in the following passage by Matthew:

Matthew 1:18-25

"18 Now the birth of Jesus the Messiah took place in this way. When his mother Mary had been engaged to Joseph, but before they lived together, she was found to be pregnant from the Holy Spirit. 19 Her husband Joseph, being a righteous man and unwilling to expose her to public disgrace, planned to divorce her quietly. 20 But just when he had resolved to do this, an angel of the Lord appeared to him in a dream and said, "Joseph, son of David, do not be afraid to take Mary as your wife, for the child conceived in her is from the Holy Spirit. 21 She will bear a son, and you are to name him Jesus, for he will save his people from their sins." 22 All this took place to fulfill what had been spoken by the Lord through the prophet:

23 "Look, the virgin shall become pregnant and give birth to a son, and they shall name him Emmanuel, "which means, "God is with us." 24 When Joseph awoke from sleep, he did as the angel of the Lord commanded him; he took her as his wife 25 but had no marital relations with her until she had given birth to a son, and he named him Jesus." So, how is hope playing a role in our congregation? Beginning 2025, I will be leading the youth program, and I am looking forward to leading the youth. I am hopeful for the new year, a different type of ministry for me to get involved in! I will be leading youth events and education, but with one change: I will need lots of help from volunteers to make it successful. PASTOR Caroline's REPORT:

Since Sheri Anderson has resigned, I have been told I will be taking over her responsibilities; I have not yet met with the personnel committee to discuss what my duties will be.

Worship:

Pr. Fitch and I have been working together on preaching. We split our preaching duties for the most part (except for festivals) and on weekends we don't preach, we preside. Sheri did Children's messages on Sunday mornings when I preached, and I did the children's message on Saturday nights. Since Sheri left, I've been doing children's messages when I preach. This year we will have the Longest Night (Blue Christmas) service. We continue to stream our 10:30 service online as well as some special services. I attended a Worship and Music Committee meeting this last month.

Visitation:

Visitation has been busy this year. Pr. Fitch and I have a protocol in place for visitations, and we keep a log of those we have visited so we can keep track of those who need multiple visits. Education (Sunday school, mid-week studies, small group):
