



#### HOLY BAPTISM WITH AFFIRMATION OF BAPTISM

### Introduction

Candidates for baptism, sponsors, and parents gather at the font together with those making public affirmation of baptism and with the ministers. The assembly may be seated.

The presiding minister may address the assembly in these or similar words. God, who is rich in mercy and love, gives us a new birth into a living hope through the sacrament of baptism. By water and the Word, God delivers us from sin and death and raises us to new life in Jesus Christ. We are united with all the baptized in the one body of Christ, anointed with the gift of the Holy Spirit, and joined in God's mission for the life of the world.

### Presentation for Baptism

Sponsors for each candidate for baptism, in turn, present the candidates.

I present <u>Clara Jane Wilber</u> for baptism.

The presiding minister addresses parents or others who bring for baptism children who are not able to answer for themselves.

Called by the Holy Spirit,

trusting in the grace and love of God,

do you desire to have your child baptized into Christ?

Response: I do

As you bring *your child* to receive the gift of baptism, you are entrusted with responsibilities:

to live with *her* among God's faithful people,

bring her to the word of God and the holy supper,

teach her the Lord's Prayer, the Creed, and the Ten Commandments,

place in her hands the holy scriptures,

and nurture her in faith and prayer,

so that your child may learn to trust God,

proclaim Christ through word and deed,

care for others and the world God made,

and work for justice and peace.

Do you promise to help your child grow in the Christian faith and life?

Response: I do

The presiding minister addresses sponsors of candidates for baptism.

Sponsors, do you promise to nurture this person in the Christian faith

as you are empowered by God's Spirit, and to help *her* live in the covenant of baptism and in communion with the church?

Response: I do

### Presentation for Affirmation of Baptism

The presiding minister may note briefly the occasion for this affirmation of baptism.

A sponsor or another representative of the congregation presents those making affirmation.

I present <u>Sara and David Wilber</u>, who desire to make public affirmation of *their* baptism.

The presiding minister may continue with prayer for those making affirmation.

Let us pray.

Merciful God, we thank you for this sister and brother,

whom you have made your own by water and the Word in baptism.

You have called *them* to yourself, enlightened *them* with the gifts of your Spirit, and nourished *them* in the community of faith. Uphold your *servants* in the gifts and promises of baptism, and unite the hearts of all whom you have brought to new birth. We ask this in the name of Christ. **Amen.** 

The assembly stands.

### Profession of Faith

The presiding minister addresses candidates for baptism, the parents and sponsors of young children who are to be baptized and those making public affirmation of baptism. The assembly may join in the responses.

I ask you to profess your faith in Christ Jesus, reject sin, and confess the faith of the church.

Do you renounce the devil and all the forces that defy God?

**Response:** I renounce them.

Do you renounce the powers of this world that rebel against God?

**Response:** I renounce them.

Do you renounce the ways of sin that draw you from God?

**Response:** I renounce them.

The presiding minister addresses the candidates and the assembly.

Do you believe in God the Father?

# I believe in God, the Father almighty, creator of heaven and earth.

Do you believe in Jesus Christ, the Son of God?

I believe in Jesus Christ, God's only Son, our Lord, who was conceived by the Holy Spirit, born of the virgin Mary, suffered under Pontius Pilate, was crucified, died, and was buried; he descended into hell.

On the third day he rose again; he ascended into heaven, he is seated at the right hand of the Father, and he will come to judge the living and the dead.

Do you believe in God the Holy Spirit?

I believe in the Holy Spirit, the holy catholic church, the communion of saints, the forgiveness of sins, the resurrection of the body, and the life everlasting.

### <u>Affirmation of Baptism</u>

The presiding minister addresses those making public affirmation of baptism.

Sisters and brothers who are affirming baptism today:

You have made public profession of your faith.

Do you intend to continue in the covenant God made with you in holy baptism:

to live among God's faithful people,

to hear the word of God and share in the Lord's supper,

to proclaim the good news of God in Christ through word and deed,

to serve all people, following the example of Jesus,

and to strive for justice and peace in all the earth?

Response: I do, and I ask God to help and guide me.

The minister addresses the assembly.

People of God,

do you promise to support *those* who *are* baptized today, and *those* making public affirmation of *their* baptism, and to pray for *them* in *their* life in Christ?

### We do, and we ask God to help and guide us.

### Thanksgiving at the Font

The presiding minister leads the following or another form of the thanksgiving.

The Lord be with you.

### And also with you.

Let us give thanks to the Lord our God.

### It is right to give our thanks and praise.

Water may be poured into the font before or during the thanksgiving.

We give you thanks, O God,

for in the beginning your Spirit moved over the waters

and by your Word you created the world,

calling forth life in which you took delight.

Through the waters of the flood you delivered Noah and his family,

and through the sea you led your people Israel from slavery into freedom.

At the river your Son was baptized by John and anointed with the Holy Spirit.

By the baptism of Jesus' death and resurrection

you set us free from the power of sin and death

and raise us up to live in you.

Pour out your Holy Spirit, the power of your living Word,

that those who are washed in the waters of baptism may be given new life.

To you be given honor and praise through Jesus Christ our Lord,

in the unity of the Holy Spirit, now and forever.

### Amen.

### <u>Baptism</u>

The assembly may be seated. The presiding minister baptizes each candidate.

Water is poured on the candidate's head, as the presiding minister says:

Clara Jane, I baptize you in the name of the Father,

and of the Son,

and of the Holy Spirit, Amen.

### You belong to Christ, in whom you have been baptized. Alleluia.

The presiding minister continues:

Let us pray.

We give you thanks, O God,

that through water and the Holy Spirit

you give your daughters and sons new birth,

cleanse them from sin, and raise them to eternal life.

Laying both hands on the head of each of the newly baptized, the minister prays for each:

Sustain *Clara Jane* with the gift of your Holy Spirit:

the spirit of wisdom and understanding, the spirit of counsel and might, the spirit of knowledge and the fear of the Lord,

the spirit of joy in your presence, both now and forever.

#### Amen.

The presiding minister marks the sign of the cross on the forehead of each of the newly baptized. Oil prepared for this purpose may be used. As the sign of the cross is made, the minister says:

<u>Clara Jane</u>, child of God,

you have been sealed by the Holy Spirit and marked with the cross of Christ forever.

#### Amen.

The presiding minister may also pray for those making affirmation of baptism. Let us pray.

We give you thanks, O God,

that through water and the Holy Spirit you give us new birth,

cleanse us from sin, and raise us to eternal life.

The presiding minister may lay both hands on the head of each person making affirmation of baptism and say:

Stir up in <u>Sara/David</u> the gift of your Holy Spirit: the spirit of wisdom and understanding, the spirit of counsel and might, the spirit of knowledge and the fear of the Lord, the spirit of joy in your presence, both now and forever.

### Amen.

### **Welcome**

A lighted candle may be given to each of the newly baptized (to a sponsor of a young child) as a representative of the congregation says:

Let your light so shine before others that they may see your good works and glorify your Father in heaven.

The ministers and those gathered at the font face the assembly. A representative of the congregation addresses the assembly.

Let us welcome the newly baptized and rejoice with *those* making public affirmation of baptism.

We rejoice with you in the life of baptism. Together we will give thanks and praise to God and proclaim the good news to all the world.

Those who have gathered at the font may return to their places.




